MINUTES

Call to Order: Michael Saucier called the joint meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Neighbors', Elected Officials and Candidates Comments:

Resident Mike Vesely provided feedback on the difficulty finding information on the ISVA website, Facebook page and Taste of The Village in general.

Law Enforcement Report: Specialist McCarty provided the law enforcement report for the month of September. Indian Springs Arrests: 2 DWI, 1 public intoxication, no narcotics, 1 criminal mischief, 3 burglary of a motor vehicle, no burglary of a building and no burglary of a home. There were 21 vehicle crashes this month across Indian Springs. Indian Springs had a total of 479 calls for service including 161 area patrols, 4 vacation watches, 15 welfare checks, 16 suspicious persons, 8 suspicious vehicles, and 2 arrests.

MCSO reminded about the autism awareness program and the 9PM routine. They provided safety tips for shopping season - in the parking lot, while shopping and online shopping as well as bank juggings.

Elected Officials and Candidates-None

Secretary's Report: Minutes from the August, September, October meetings were distributed without feedback. All minutes were passed as circulated.

Treasurer's Report: Tripp was not able to make the meeting but provided the treasurer's report. Taste of the Village Financials – Total Income \$11,511.40 and total expenditures \$11,188.19, with a total \$14,4432.93 spent so far in the FY. The budget was approved as presented.

The Woodlands Township: Abbey Miller distributed The Woodlands Township schedule of events:

- Nov 17 – Glow in the Park at Texas Tree Ventures
- Ice rink opens Nov 18 through Jan 15
- Nov 18 - Lighting of the Doves

Old / Recurring Business:

Parks & Recreation Advisory Council – Tina provided an report from the latest meeting.

- Turf installation at Falconwing Park will occur over the winter and will be focusing on the drainage; Pool improvement to complete before summer season
- New recreation area of 208 acres ceded from Howard Hughes to Woodlands Parks and Rec – utilization TBD
- Batting cages should be open at Bear Branch before the end of the year
- 2024 Parks and Rec budget increase of \$1.2M based partially on the increase in mixed beverage tax

RDRC Update – There is no current representative so no report

Woodlands Magazine – Michael to write an article about getting involved and elections for the new year

ISVA Social Media – 807 Facebook followers (up 15); 89 Instagram followers (up 1); Taste Ad results: 42,340 Reach in 22 days with \$330 spent.
