MINUTES

Call to Order: Maryann Braid called the joint meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Neighbors', Elected Officials and Candidates Comments:

Law Enforcement Report: Specialist McKee provided the law enforcement report for the month of October. Indian Springs had 4 DWI, no public intoxication, no narcotics arrest, 1 criminal mischief, 1 burglary of a motor vehicle, no burglary of a building and no home burglary. There were 15 vehicle crashes this month across Indian Springs. 554 calls for service, including 145 area patrols, 57 vacation watches, 181 traffic stops, 29 suspicious persons, 12 suspicious vehicles, and 9 arrest.

MCSO reminded during holiday shopping to park in well-lit areas and do not leave packages in plain sight in vehicles. – Limit how much cash and number of cards that you carry and don't approach vehicles alone. Shop only from reputable businesses

Secretary's Report: Minutes from the September and October meeting were reviewed but could not be approved as there was not a quorum. To be circulated for approval via email.

Treasurer's Report: Tripp provided the report on the projected forecast of \$20,105 after payment of expenses with \$16K of unrestricted funds. Taste of the Village expenditures totaled \$11,214 with expectation of bank fees to still be removed.

The Woodlands Township: Erin Redmon distributed The Woodlands Township schedule of events and the Board of Directors Meetings. Key dates:

Old / Recurring Business:

Parks & Recreation Advisory Council – Meeting was moved until after the election; Falconwing Park has broken ground and expected to complete in April

Law Enforcement Advisory Council Update –

LT Julie Thompson from Conroe Independent School District spoke on the school district police department. 82 police officers including 3 detectives and 3 K-9 (2 drug dogs and 1 explosive) units across 67 campuses; All high schools and junior highs have officers and the elementary schools share.

Dispatch gets 911 calls from within geofence of the schools. Department receives tips from several different apps and reviews any threat including investigating at student's houses. Conducted a recent offsite movement at Mitchell and got all 1000 moved in 16-18 minutes to park;

All school doors can be remotely unlocked by dispatch and are numbered. Dispatch has visibility of all cameras and some schools have over 100 cameras. Will also be carrying Narcan

There is a new app called RAVE where anyone can report an active shooter and goes out to all subscribers; school district will be rolling this out when testing is complete around beginning of 2023

CPT Holifield From MCSO spoke on the trending calls for service and decrease through the last quarter; for first time in last 5 years starting to see property crimes increasing especially with the catalytic converter thefts. Violent crimes are steady rate. Frauds and scams continue to increase especially with young people and images – provided instance where suicide followed blackmail regarding explicit photo.

There is an issue with break ins on the mailboxes outside the post office based on thieves with keys

Taste of the Village –

- Estimated Attendance
 - Vendor and attendee feedback - received more positive feedback on the setup compared to the previous location. With level of sound some vendors mentioned difficulty in customers
 - Raffle Income - \$1,720 total
 - Final Expenses and Income – awaiting payments from two vendors
 - Mike and Aimee wrote a thank you letter for the vendors and will send out
- Holiday Lighting Committee – Mike Ranc to lead; Village to be split in 6 zones and judging to take place weekend before the Christmas party.
- Scholarship committee – Ree to transfer information to Zach
