**Law Enforcement Report:** Specialist Olowinski provided the law enforcement report for the month of January. Indian Springs had 2 DWI, 2 public intoxication, 1 narcotics arrest, 1 criminal mischief, no burglary of a motor vehicle, no burglary of a building and no home burglary. There were 12 vehicle crashes this month across Indian Springs. 690 total calls for service, including 266 area patrols, 36 vacation watches, 14 suspicious persons, 1 suspicious vehicles, and 15 arrests.

- Finished the month with \$18,683.60 in the bank.

- Spring Fling Event proposed with \$1,500 budget for April/May in FY 2023.
- Budget will require to transfer \$400 from unrestricted to restricted money to balance for new fiscal year.
