Law Enforcement Report: Specialist Tavaréz provided the law enforcement report for the month of April. Indian Springs had 6 DWI, no public intoxication, 1 narcotics arrest, no criminal mischief, no burglary of a motor vehicle, no burglary of a building and no home burglary. There were 16 vehicle crashes this month across Indian Springs. 555 calls for service, including 146 area patrols, 34 vacation watches, 193 traffic stops, 18 suspicious persons.

April is autism month and MCSO is continuing to promote their Autism program. They also promoted their public service announcements that are released each month, neighborhood watch, and a 9PM check.

Law Enforcement Advisory Council Update – Matt provided an update from the 4/28/22 meeting. Denise Jimenez, Montgomery County Sheriff Dept Communication Director gave a presentation of the dispatch office. Text to 911 is currently available with Gen 1 and Gen 2 will add photo and text. Can add Smart911 app onto phone which delivers details such as medical, etc to dispatcher when you call. Any old phone can reach 911 so recommended. Program the non-emergency number (936-760-5800) into phone.

Sheriff's department provided the quarterly report and shows that overall crime is down over the past 4 years. They provided a year over year report. There was discussion on the recent thefts of catalytic converters and recommended use of cages and calling prior to large gatherings (churches etc) which may be targets for thieves.
